Writing outcomes: poetry, narratives, letters and debates. Spelling: Adding the suffix -ly (to adjectives to form adverbs). Apply their growing knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes (etymology and morphology)

Grammar and punctuation: choosing nouns or pronouns appropriately for clarity and cohesion and to avoid repetition. Using conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause. Using the correct tense and paragraphing.

Reading: reading books that are structured in different ways and reading for a range of purposes. Using dictionaries to check the meaning of words that they have read. Working specifically on inference, comprehension and summarising.
