English

We will base our learning around the texts: Observational Poems, Historical and Modern Letters and 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo.

Skills: In the poetry topic, writing an observational poem. In the letters topic, composing a letter. In the modern classic novel topic, writing a narrative.

Writing outcomes: poem, letter and narrative

Spelling: This half term the focus is on the Statutory Spelling Words for Years 5 and 6 (also known as the Common Exception Words).

Grammar and punctuation: Expanded noun phrases, relative pronouns and clauses, the 4 sentence types, the 4 main word classes, apostrophes of possession and contraction, conventions and rules of speech punctuation when using dialogue in stories.

French

- 'Clothing and Shops' is the topic.

Pupils will learn more items of clothing and how to conjugate the verb 'to wear' for different pronouns in the present tense. Pupils will write, describing what they are wearing, as well as talking and asking about what other people are wearing. Pupils will also learn the names for different shops.

Computing

- 'iTech' is the topic.

Pupils will be tasked with investigating and solving a crime. Before going to trial they will learn about evidence collecting and analysing, code breaking, observation and communication skills as well as presenting evidence.
