Year 4

English

We will base our learning around the text The Lion and The Unicorn by Jane Ray and The Matchbox Diary. Children will be writing their own version historical narratives through letters, diaries, character and setting descriptions, non-chronological reports.

The Lion and The Unicorn: To engage children with stories with which they will empathise. To explore themes and issues, and develop and sustain ideas through discussion. To develop creative responses to the text through drama, storytelling and artwork. To write in role in order to explore and develop empathy for characters. To develop reader response by exploring interpretations of themes, plots and characters' actions and motivations through discussion and debate.

The Matchbox Diary by Paul Fleischman, the children discover a set of matchboxes containing some mementoes from the story. Children will be writing predictions, inferences and will be exploring prepositions. Children will plan and then write a non-chronological report about the great-grandfather's and other who made a similar journey all those years ago.
