Communication and Language

Physical Development

The children will develop their fine motor skills through manipulating cutlery, brushes, pens, pencils and scissors. They will have access to balance bikes, large blocks and P.E. sessions to build on their gross motor skills and physical stamina.

In Reception we will practise engaging in conversations with classmates and familiar adults, sharing stories and books. The children will be encouraged to ask questions and offer opinions.

Phonics

Movement and rhythm awareness encourages children to become attentive listeners, recognising and describing patterns within music, fostering an ability to engage with different musical experiences. This unit focuses on refining motor skills. Children engage in activities that involve skipping, hopping, and jumping to the rhythm of music, enhancing their coordination and rhythm awareness.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

The children will be encourage to make new friends in class by sharing information about what they like to do, their favourite books, where they like to go and what they like to eat.
