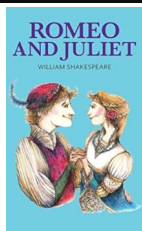




English Writing

Properties of materials

We will test materials for magnetism, transparency and hardness, and learn about electrical conductivity. We will also plan, investigate and evaluate an insulating heat experiment and look at uses of everyday materials (plastic, wood and metal).

Mathematics

Multiplication and Division

Multiply numbers up to 4 digits by 1 or 2 digits using various methods. Solve multiplication problems. Use short division, including dividing 4-digit numbers by 1-digit

Fractions

Multiply fractions and mixed numbers by integers. Calculate fractions of quantities and amounts. Find the whole from a given fraction. Use fractions as operators.

Music

Pop Music: Arrangements and Improvisation

Students will explore the world of popular music, focusing on arrangements and improvisation. Pupils begin creating their arrangements and experimenting with improvisation, gaining valuable experience that prepares them for more intricate composition and performance tasks in subsequent years.

Geography

East Anglia, Yorkshire and the Midlands

We will explore the physical geography and land use of East Anglia, settlements in the Midlands, and physical and human geography of Yorkshire and Humberside

History

The French Revolution

We will explore life in France before the Revolution, the reign of Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette, and key events including Napoleon's rise, the Battles of Trafalgar and Waterloo.

Music (Violin)

We will explore The Showdown Hoe Down and Pizzicato Swing, enhancing ensemble skills, listening, performing, and self-evaluation. Using 2/4 time, we'll revisit note values, sing melodies, and practise violin techniques, including ties and pizzicato, boosting confidence through group and solo performances.

We will explore East Anglia's physical geography and land use, settlements in the Midlands, and both the physical and human geography of Yorkshire and Humberside.

French
