Year 6

English

Having analysed and evaluated different performance poems by the likes of Roald Dahl, the class will be writing and performing their own using all the different features they've identified as being in performance poems.

We will be reading *The Crowstarver* by Dick King-Smith and the class will use their reading skills of summarising, clarifying, inferring etc. to demonstrate their understanding of the text. The students will then use King-Smith's writing as a model for their own short story.

After the half term, Year 6 will be using the non-fiction text *I* Am Malala to write a persuasive speech on the right of every child to have an education. Also, they will be studying Maya Angelou's Life Doesn't Frighten Me poem to write their own.

The book that the class will be reading in the second half of the term is *The Hound of the Baskervilles* by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. It's a brilliant novel to explore more archaic language, connections between different characters and how an atmosphere can be created.

During both reading and writing lessons, grammar, punctuation and spelling is taught.

Maths

Measurement – time, mass, perimeter and area Number – place value, four operations, decimals, fractions Algebra

Geometry – properties of shapes Ratio and proportion

Year 6 are being challenged to work in groups to design and build a bridge which stretches 30 cm and can hold 1 kg of weight. They will have to research the different types of famous bridge designs and critically evaluate them in order for their own bridge to be a success.

Music

They have singing practice and a music lesson where they are given the opportunity to compose their own pieces of music and perform them using a variety of instruments. In their weekly performing arts lesson, they perform songs and dances.

French

Computing

First, pupils will then be tasked with designing and creating their own social media platform. They will use more advanced functions in Word to plan their ideas before finally collating them into a Keynote ready to be presented to their peers.

In the second module, pupils will learn basic and advanced editing techniques and video effects to produce a music video. Pupils will edit, cut and splice footage supplied to them in order to create their final video.
