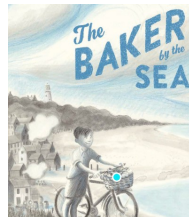

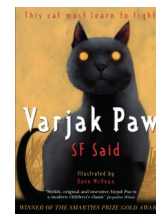
The Lion and The Baker by the Sea by Paula White and Shackleton's Journey by William Grill

Mathematics

Decimals

Understanding place value by making a whole with tenths and hundredths, partitioning and flexibly partitioning decimals, comparing and ordering decimals, rounding to the nearest whole number, and representing halves and quarters as decimals.

Money

Writing money using decimals, converting between pounds and pence, comparing amounts, estimating costs, calculating with money, and solving real-world money problems.

Art

Monuments of the Byzantine Empire

Monuments: Hagia Sofia, Basilica of San Vitale – Ravenna, Pupils should be taught to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

Geography

London and South East England

Exploring the South East of England by identifying its counties and key cities, including London, Canterbury, Brighton, and Dover; understanding human and physical characteristics, topographical features, and land-use patterns; and assessing changes over time.

History

The Stuarts

Exploring James I and the Union of the Crowns, the causes and consequences of the Gunpowder Plot, the reign of Charles I, the key events of the English Civil War, Oliver Cromwell and the Commonwealth, and the restoration of Charles II.

Pupils will learn to confidently describe different weather conditions and use simple phrases to talk about the weather in various seasons. They will practise listening and speaking skills through songs, games, and role-play activities, building their vocabulary and pronunciation.
