



Theme	Literacy	Phonics
This term, our Nursery theme takes us on a magical journey through the world of Kings and Queens! We'll introduce children to the fascinating lives of monarchs, explore the grandeur of Castles and Kingdoms, and shine a spotlight on Famous Kings and Queens from history. We'll also bring in the excitement of Knights, Dragons, and Myths, allowing for some adventurous storytelling. Finally, we'll celebrate with Coronations and Crowning Ceremonies, giving our children a taste of royalty!	We will listen to enchanting stories about kings, queens, and castles, chatting about the characters we will meet. We will identify key words like "castle," "knight," and "dragon," matching them to fun pictures. We will explore letters in royal words such as crown, king, and queen. We will draw and label our own castles, and we will team up to create a thrilling story about a brave knight!	<b>Read, Write Inc Phonics and Daily Supported Reading</b>  Children will continue to have daily streamed phonics and reading lessons. Please ensure they are reading for 20 minutes every evening and this is being recorded in their reading records. Children will be reassessed for their levels towards the end of the term.

How do the fire brigade help us? How do doctors and nurses look after us?	The children will march like soldiers while counting their steps. They will identify shapes in captivating castle structures, spotting squares for towers and triangles for roofs. They will count and sort sparkly royal treasures like gems and gold coins and will compare sizes by sorting big and small castles. Finally, they will build "royal towers" with blocks and count how high they can go!	<u>Feeling the Music</u> As the summer term approaches, Nursery children delve into the world of playing and responding to music in the "Feeling the Music" unit, exploring how music makes them feel. They learn to notice patterns within music and describe their emotions, fostering a deeper connection to the art form.
Understanding the World	Expressive Arts and Design	Personal, Social, Emotional Development
The children will talk about real kings and queens and their roles in history. We will look at pictures of majestic castles and discuss their unique features. Next, we will learn about brave knights and their duty to protect castles. We'll watch a fun video of a royal coronation, and finally, we will pretend to be royalty, acting out a day in the life of a king or queen!	We will paint crowns with shimmering gold and silver paint, and craft colourful paper castles using glue and a range of resources. The children will create knight shields from cardboard and foil, and build castles from recycled boxes. Finally, we will wrap up by decorating royal robes using fabric scraps and sparkly glitter!	In the first week, our children will become "royal helpers," assisting the king or queen with preparations for a special event. Next, they will create a "castle friendship" system, taking turns being kings, queens, knights, and guests. We will then discuss the importance of being kind and fair leaders. Following that, they will practice turn-taking through a fun "knight's challenge" game, and we will conclude with a delightful royal banquet to celebrate teamwork!
