We will focus on recognising sentences and using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops as well and working on our handwriting.

**RWI Phonics and Daily Supported Reading**  
Children will continue to have daily streamed phonics and reading lessons. Please ensure they are reading for 20 minutes every evening and this is being recorded in their reading records. Children will be reassessed for their levels towards the end of the term.

**Plants**  
We will about different types of plants and trees. Children will be exposed to a range of different plants that have a variety of leaf shapes and flowers. Through grouping and classifying the plant parts, children will be encouraged to make generalisations and spot simple patterns between them. Children will explore the parts of a tree.

**Islam : What does it mean to be a Muslim?**

**Multiplication and Division and Place Value to 100**

Children will begin to explore the mathematical concepts of multiplication and division. We will share and group objects equally and count in our 2s, 5s and 10s.

Children explore oral counting of numbers 50 to 100, both forwards and backwards. We will provide opportunities for them to hear the patterns in the sequence of numbers and to help them get used to the sound of the number names.

**Singing and Playing Skills**

Year 1 culminates with a focus on singing and playing skills, with an emphasis on pitch-matching during the summer term. This unit aligns with the curriculum's goal of nurturing vocal and instrumental abilities. Pupils refine their pitch-matching skills, preparing them to sing and play simple melodies and harmonies in the upcoming year. This unit builds on their knowledge of high and low pitches, encouraging them to become more confident musicians.

**The Seven Continents**
