English

Writing: For our first few sessions, we will continue writing from Rob Sanders', 'Stonewall.' The children will produce adverts, short news reports and write in role.

After, we will work from W H Auden's, 'Night Mail.' Writing outcomes will include summaries, analysis and performances.

Following this, we will write from 'Romeo and Juliet.' This will involve diary entries, letters, narratives, dialogues, setting descriptions and character descriptions.

Reading: 'The Crowstarver,' Dick King Smith

GPS: RWI spellings and discrete grammar lessons, based on misconceptions/errors from writing. Active/passive voice and the subjunctive form.

Maths

Converting units: metric and imperial

Ratio: ratio & fractions, scale and scale drawing, problem solving.

Algebra: form expressions, equations, pairs of values, one and two step problems

Decimals: multiplying and dividing by 10, 100, 1000, integers, adding and subtracting decimals
