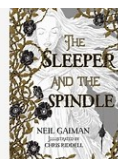




English Writing

We will continue to build on the children's growing collection of writing, with a focus on narrative progression and the development of rich, purposeful vocabulary. Writing outcomes this term will include persuasive texts, dialogues, character descriptions and diary entries, based on 'The Sleeper and the Spindle', a dark, reimagined fairy tale.



English Reading

We will be reading 'The London Eye Mystery' by Siobhan Dowd, a mystery novel following a character who tries to solve the disappearance of his cousin from the London Eye. As part of our Reading lessons this term, we'll continue to develop vocabulary, inference and retrieval skills, make predictions and find links to other texts and the wider world.



Geography

New Zealand

We will learn about New Zealand the South Pacific Island, focusing on physical features such as volcanoes, geysers and earthquakes. Later in the unit, we will learn about Melanesia, Micronesia and Polynesia, and the Maori people. Finally, we will study the climate and ecosystems in New Zealand, building on our learning about invasive species from Spring 2.

Religious Education

Islam

How do Muslims live and embrace their faith in a diverse world?

Week 1 and 2: What difference do you think it would make to a Muslim to repeat the Shahadah and greeting several times a day?

Week 3 and 4: Does connecting today's message with ancient buildings make a difference? If yes, why and if not why not? Week 5: What does giving to charity mean for a Muslim?

Mathematics

Decimals: We will be learning how to add and subtract decimals as well as multiply and divide decimals number by 10, 100 and 1000.

Negative Numbers: We will learn to count through zero in ones and multiples. **Converting Units:** Students will learn how to convert between units of time and length.

Volume: Pupils will learn to calculate, estimate and compare capacity.

History

The Victorian Age

In this unit, students will learn about the reign of Queen Victoria. In addition to the political context of this time, we will also look at the social aspects of Victorian Britain, especially focusing on the Great Exhibition. We will consistently link our new learning to knowledge of the Industrial Revolution, studied in Summer 1.
